

Were your ancestors freemasons? The Library and Museum of Freemasonry has released details of over 1.7 million names listed in membership registers from 1751-1921 on the genealogical search gateway, Ancestry.co.uk

This has enabled many to discover for the first time details for family members and individuals associated with freemasonry, who were active in local communities in England and Wales as well as overseas.

This half-day event aims to provide an introduction to finding information about freemasons using Ancestry and how the on-line catalogue of the Library and Museum of Freemasonry can help you to find additional resources for family and local history. It will also provide information about accessible resources yet to be added to the catalogue.

Two case studies will demonstrate how the rich resources in the museum, library and archive collections can add fascinating details to your family history research and lead you beyond the basic membership information.

You are welcome to bring along your laptop or tablet - WIFI is available to search the catalogue and access Ancestry at the Library and Museum.
